Government of India has reemphasised this by suggesting constitution of State Level Export Promotion Committee (SLEPC) at State level headed by the Chief Secretary of the State comprising officers of Government of India/State Government. Funds are also being made available to State Governments for bridging gaps in infrastructure affecting exports from the States.

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF COMMERCE AND INDUSTRY (SHRICHENNAMANENIVIDYA SAGAR RAO): (a)Yes, Sir.

(b)The Committee has, *inter alia*, recommended re-engineering of regulatory processes at the Central and State level for simplification of the procedures relating to the grant of various approvals and rationalization of the inspection, record keeping and reporting requirements. The recommendations also envisage greater use of information technology tools in the administration of approvals.

Implementation of these recommendations has been initiated in 21 Ministries/Departments of the Government of India. List of such Ministries/ Departments is annexed as Statement. (See below)

(c) A specific monitoring mechanism is not envisaged in the report. The recommendations, *inter alia*, require Ministries/Departments to suggest a generic structure for re-engineering of regulatory processes at State level also.
